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PALM SUNDAY

This Sunday we celebrate Palm Sunday which is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the re-enactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect. Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday. The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, it represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are sometimes distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These palms may be returned to the Church, or kept for the year. Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the Church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the following year's Ash Wednesday observance. The colours of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

Principal's message:

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN GOSSIP AND RUMOURS

This week we have spent time working with our Grade 3-6 students to build their understanding of the dangers of spreading rumours and gossip within a school community. It's important for all in our school community to understand the damage and hurt that these practices can cause to individuals or groups.

Gossip refers to the casual talk, true or false, about people and the personal lives of others, which is shared between individuals. The characteristics of gossip are :

- Gossip is 'juicy' in some way, meaning it is in relation to shocking or personal information.
- Gossip is generally about private information which people do not generally like to talk about openly such as relationships.
- Gossip is often hurtful as it involves sharing personal information about individuals.
- Gossip is usually spread behind the subject's back.

An example of gossip is "Did you hear that Jenny and Tom broke up? She is dating someone else now!"

Rumours refer to spreading unverified information about someone or something. It may be a truth or a falsehood. Rumours are usually spread by a person with a specific intention; most often this is to damage the characters of the person involved.

- Rumours often spread from person to person or from one person to a group at once.
- Rumours often change slightly each time they are told, often becoming exaggerated each time.
- A rumour may be true, it might be partly true and partly made up, or it may be entirely fabricated. Unless somebody can definitely say that a story is true or false, it will stay a rumour.

An example of a rumour is "I heard that anybody who fails the next history test is going to have to repeat the course over the summer."



Decide whether it's hurtful or harmless.

When you hear something about someone and consider passing it on, ask yourself these questions:

- Why do I want to pass this on?
- Would I want people to know this kind of information about me?
- How will this person feel if he or she knew this rumour was being spread?

Your answers will help you figure out the right thing to do.

Advice for all our students:

Make the rumour stop with you

If you decide that the rumour is hurtful in some way, make a stand and don't pass it on. Others may continue to circulate the gossip, but you've made a choice to stay out of it. Chances are that the rumour will die out much more quickly than if you had joined in.

Don't be an audience

When someone comes to you with a rumour, try not to be an audience. This person may want to hurt somebody, or may be after attention. It can be hard to resist hearing some juicy dish, but make an effort to say, "I'm not interested in hearing mean gossip, thanks."

Hearing and reacting to the rumour, and letting it continue, makes you responsible for the damage too. If that person isn't getting the reaction or attention they are seeking, they will be less likely to do it in the future.

Be a peacemaker

If one of your friends wants to hurt someone else by spreading lies or rumours, speak up. Let your friend know that this isn't the right thing to do. If rumours are getting out of control and someone is being made a real victim, seek the help of a teacher.

Respect others' privacy

If you don't want other people talking about the personal things in your life, don't do it to others. When you hear personal information about a classmate or friend, keep it to yourself. If you respect people's privacy, they'll be more likely to do the same for you.

Resist the urge to get revenge

If you have been the victim of gossip and rumours and you know who's been spreading them, it is tempting to think up lies or expose their secrets. While taking revenge in this way might feel good for a short time in the end, it will just keep the cycle of rumours going, and will make you as much of a bully as any other rumour-starter.

MANAGING CHANGES IN FRIENDSHIPS

Healthy friendships are a very important part of a child's social and emotional wellbeing. They teach children empathy, fairness and help foster a sense of belonging.

As children get older, friendships play an increasingly important role in their lives. And as children grow and change, it is inevitable that friendships will change too. The 3-year-old girls who loved to play tea parties become 8-year-olds who simply have different interests now. Helping children manage these changes provides an opportunity to teach children coping skills and will help support their positive mental health. There are many reasons for changes in friendships to occur including, conflict, growing apart, changes in interests, or moving schools.

It is also important to understand that the occasional conflict is a normal part of friendship. It is an opportunity for children to learn empathy, by trying to understand the perspective of their friend. Changes in friendship also allow children to learn effective ways to express their own views in a healthy way, and seek to be understood in return. Sometimes these conflicts are resolved, and the friendship continues, and sometimes the conflict results in the loss of a friendship.

When friendships end, it might be mutual, or it could be initiated by one child, leaving the other child feeling rejected. It is often difficult for families to see their children going through these experiences, but friendship transitions are inevitable in life, and there are a few things that families can do to help children through it:

- Empathise with how they are feeling. A child who has been rejected might be feeling sad, confused or possibly angry. These feelings are all understandable reactions to a friendship rejection and helping children to recognise these feelings will help them feel understood and loved, and hopefully allow them to move on more easily.
- Encourage multiple friendships. Having a broad group of friends, or even different groups of friends can help children weather stormy friendship times. When one friendship hits the rocks, seeking respite with other friends can help a child move on more quickly, and sometimes will help the friendship continue past a rough patch or help a new friendship develop and grow.
- Encourage repair. If a friendship that is usually healthy takes a turn for the worse, families might consider helping their child to problem-solve and repair the friendship. Encourage empathy with the other child's feelings and help the child to express their own feelings to their friend.
- Help the child to recognise when it is time to move on. Friendships should be about having fun together, respect and fairness. If the child is feeling rejected, hurt or sad as a result of a particular friendship, families may need to help them to understand that it's time to move on.

Changes in friendships may stir a range of strong emotions in children and may be their first experience of grief and rejection. Families can use this as a platform for teaching their child effective coping skills and strategies for dealing with painful emotions, as well as normalising changes in relationships. Talking with children about how the change has impacted them, ways they can manage and how to move forward are important conversations to have.

It is important to resist the temptation to 'problem solve' directly with the friend's family. Not only can this sometimes create more problems, but it removes an opportunity for children to practice their social and emotional skills.

If you feel your child is having difficulty or challenges relating to friendships, please make a time to meet with your child's teacher to discuss your concerns.

HEAD LICE

We have had several cases of head lice reported at school. If lice are discovered, your child may return to school once treatment has commenced. We recommend treating your child's hair weekly for 2-4 weeks after the initial treatment has began, especially if the lice are re-occurring, as lice can take up to 7 days to hatch and it is very easy to miss an egg or 2. P&F PLAYGROUND GRANT UPDATE

Thanks to the great efforts by the 2017 P&F and the P&F Grants Officer, Tiffany Clarke, the lower level playground will be upgraded and an additional play space will be built. The P&F were successful in their application for a minor capital works grant upgrade of the senior playground. We received \$10,000 towards the supply and install of the upgraded senior playground area with the P&F to contribute a further \$10,000. The existing lower level playground will have a rock wall added, missing panels and pommels replaced and a mulch top up. A new playground on the lower level will be added on the opposite end of the oval. This will be a hanging adventure play area as shown in the image below. The installer of this equipment have informed us that they will be ready to carry out the upgrades and install the new playground within 10 weeks. We look forward to the completion of these works to allow students at St Ita's to enjoy the rejuvenated and new play spaces.

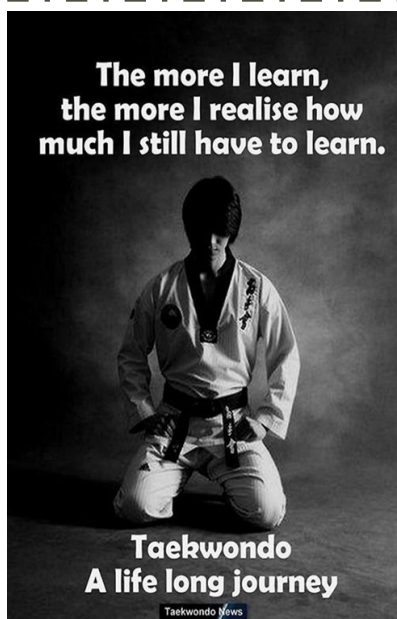
